Outdoor Sculpture and Project at Art Park

Stone Quarry Hill Art Park will open an outdoor installation and projection beginning at 8 p.m. on Thursday, September 7. The event is open to the public.

The installation and projection are the second part of an exhibition collectively entitled "Illuminations II" and comprises

the fourth group of exhibitions in the 2006 "Summer of Light" series, in which the use of light is explored through a variety of artistic media.

Courtney Frisse, of Portland, Oregon, plans a one-night projection onto the Art Park hill called "Animal Locomotion." Some of the images she will use are from the work of Eadweard Muybridge, famous for his sequential photography of

human figures and animals, published under the title "Animal Locomotion" in the late 1880's.

Also opening will be "Star Blind," an outdoor installation by artist Ron Rocco. Rocco will install his piece on the Art Park's Woodland Trail. The piece will be on view through November. Rocco, who splits his time between New York and Berlin, has exhibited across the U.S., including at P.S. 1 in New York, as well as Canada, the Netherlands and

Germany.

Also on view through the beginning of October is the work of artists Herbert Hoover, David Bowen, Mark Grimm and Amy Cheatle, all included in Illuminations. Also included in Illuminations is Wales-based artist Reiko Aoyagi's new
