THE GUGGENHEIM MUSEUM TO PRESENT THE PERFORMANCE ARTIST RON ROCCO

The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum will present the New York performance-artist Ron Rocco in two performances of his work, <u>Zaroff's Tale</u>.

The performances, to be held in the Museum's Rotunda, will be on Tuesday, September 6, and Wednesday, September 7, at 9:00 R.M.

Zaroff's Tale is a performance piece that uses a 200-foot rope and a variety of visual and audio media techniques, including dance, music and light displays, to explore the relationship between abstract string compositions—cat's cradles—and teaching mythologies associated with them in the culture of the Eskimos of Alaska. According to Mr. Rocco, the manipulation of a loop of string by the Topek Eskimos, of whom Zaroff was a chief, is an ancient art that was passed from generation to generation. The process of working a loop of string with the hands served as a bridge to successive generations passing information for life in the arctic north.

Mr. Rocco, who graduated from the State University of New York College at Purchase in 1976, was recently awarded a residency at The Experimental Television Center, Owego, New York. His previous awards include project grants for Festival Ithaca (New York) from the National Endowment for the Arts in 1977, 1978 and 1979. Mr. Rocco has had one-man sculpture exhibitions at the Gallery Danielli, Toronto, and at the Arnot Art Museum, Elmira, New York.


